We still live at home with mom and dad. I, Caitlin, have an incredible memory for names, dates, and events of everyone I meet! My brother Brendan is really friendly and likes to meet new people. We both stay really busy with Special Olympics swimming.

Even though we were in Special Education our entire lives and people knew we would need some extra help once we graduated, we both finished high school without

Medicaid Waivers. Since graduation, we've been waiting every day and hoping that one day we'd get a call saying ID Waivers are available for us both!

With it we would be able to plan better for our future, where we will live and work and know that we have sustainable employment support funding .It seems like we've been waiting forever and it's scary to not know when our Waivers will come.
