

# The Arc of Northern Virginia



The Arc of Northern Virginia was founded in 1962 and is affiliated with The Arc, a national organization founded in 1947 by a group of parents to advocate for school services for

children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ID/DD). It is estimated that there are 34,000 individuals with ID/DD living in the cities and counties of Arlington, Alexandria, Fairfax and Falls Church. The Arc of Northern Virginia builds community opportunities for citizens with disabilities so that they can live "A Life Like Yours." Our services and areas of focus include:

- Information & Referral: The Arc of Northern Virginia helps families by providing vital information about resources that are available to help them—a great challenge in a state that continues to rank 41<sup>st</sup> in funding community supports for individuals with ID/DD. The Arc of Northern Virginia's staff fields more than 5,000 information & referral requests each year, and established "Lunch Bunch" drop-in networking sessions for parents and guardians.
- **Direct Services and Case Management:** The Arc of Northern Virginia is the leading case manager for recipients of the state-funded Developmental Disability Medicaid Waiver, and works closely with area Community Services Boards, who manage services for recipients of other Medicaid waivers.
- Education: Raising a child with a disability, or having a family member with ID/DD, can be extremely complex. The Arc of Northern Virginia provides annually over 30 educational workshops and seminars on topics such as estate planning, guardianship, Medicaid Waivers, and special education advocacy. Staff and volunteers also present outreach workshops at local and state conferences and partner with other agencies to present critical information to the community.
- Advocacy: The Arc of Northern Virginia works with its constituents and their families to help them become more effective self-advocates. The Arc of Northern Virginia advocates on behalf of its members at the local, county, state, regional, and national levels. This year, The Arc of Northern Virginia has continued to focus its efforts on the landmark Department of Justice settlement with the Commonwealth of Virginia. We also have guided families with loved ones in institutions through the process of learning and transitioning to community-based services. Our advocacy efforts over the coming years will serve to ensure that the terms of the settlement are met and exceeded in order to support the transition to community-based supports for all Virginians.
- **Guardianship:** The Arc of Northern Virginia has operated the Guardianship of Last Resort (GOLR) program since 1995, serving individuals with developmental disabilities, mental health disabilities, and age-related impairments. The Arc of Northern Virginia currently serves as a state-designated GOLR for Northern Virginia, serving those who require a surrogate decision-maker but have no one else in their lives to serve in this capacity.
- Special Needs Trust Management: The Arc of Northern Virginia provides a pooled Special Needs Trust program. The trust allows individuals to receive financial support to enhance their lives without jeopardizing their public benefits such as SSI and Medicaid. The pooled trust allows families to take advantage of large fund professional investment planning and returns, while enjoying the peace of mind that comes from careful estate planning.
- Self-Advocacy Empowerment: With its People First and People First for Young Adults programs and "A Life Like Yours" Toastmasters, The Arc of Northern Virginia provides opportunities for individuals with ID/DD to get together, socialize, grow, and learn in a supportive environment, while advocating effectively for their own needs.
